# **Songwords and Extension Activities**

**Props Needed: An instrument each** 

# 1. Merry Music Go Round

(Tune of: Pop goes the weasel)
Merry, Merry Music Go Round
Merry, Merry Music
Sing and dance and play your sound
Let's make some music!

### Action:

Clap your hands in time to the music, keeping a steady pulse.

# 2. Wave Hello

# 3. Hello Mr Sun

And make my flowers grow (wiggle fingers, moving hands upwards)

Copy the actions on the video and sing the song together.

# **Action Song: Standing up**

# 4. 5 Little Speckled Frogs

5 little speckled frogs (hold up 5 fingers)
Sat on a speckled log (squat like a frog)
Eating some most delicious grubs – yum yum! (pretend to eat, and then rub tummy)
One jumped into the pool (jump like a frog)
Where it was nice and cool (swim around)
Then there were 4 green speckled frogs (hold up 4 fingers)
Glub glub!

Verse 2:..4 little speckled frogs...

Verse 3:...3 little speckled frogs...

**Verse 4**:...2 little speckled frogs... (faster) **Verse 4**:...1 little speckled frog... (faster)

#### Action:

Copy the actions on the video together, counting your fingers each time the number of frogs changes. There are quite a lot of actions here – encourage the children to join in with as many as they can!

# **Extension Activity:**

Sing the song after the video, choosing 5 children at a time to be the frogs. Everyone stands in a big circle and sings the song together, with the frogs taking turns to jump into the pool (one frog per verse). Choose an order for the frogs to jump in, and let the children know who will go first, second, third etc. It helps to remind younger children whose turn it is before singing the next verse. They love this one!

### Action:

Everybody play their instruments and sing the song together.

### **Extension Activity:**

Can the children find all of the rainbow colours in the room at nursery?

#### **Further Extension:**

For older children: ask the children to find small items e.g. bricks in all of the rainbow colours, then:

- 1. Can they line them up in the order that we sing the colours and make their own rainbow?
- 2. Can they hold an item each, sing the song together and hold up their item as their colour is sung about?
- 3. If you have some colourful dance scarves, find the rainbow colours and give the children a scarf each. Can they wave their scarf up high when their colour is sung? It will take practice but is great fun!

What other animals can the children think of related to springtime to sing about?

# 8. Flower Song

Tune: In and Out the Dusty Bluebells
Dig a hole down in the ground

V5: Flowers pop up all around...now we see our flowers! (make 'flowers' pop up)

#### Action:

Copy the actions and sing the song together.

### **Extension Activity:**

Can children tell you what the flowers need to grow?

Do they have any favourite types of flower? Which colour flowers do they like? Here is a chance to discuss Spring flowers e.g. daffodils and tulips and talk about their shapes and colours.

### **Further Extension:**

Using the same song format, can the children create new verses about other things they might like to grow e.g. potatoes or tomatoes?
